C **And will forgive our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.**


Silence for personal reflection

John 15: 1-11

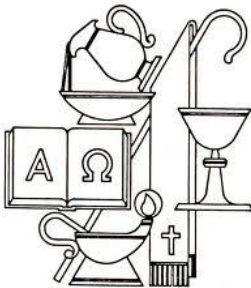
